Dr. Kituku has worked in diverse aspects of leadership with four Idaho State Governors and has presented to more corporations, including HP, Microsoft, USA Air Force and public institutions among others, than most American-born speakers. He was the first African person to speak to both the Idaho State House of Representatives and Senate. Vincent has trained leaders from numerous corporations and academic institutions in Kenya such as Safaricom, Laikipia University, Ngara Girls, Tala High School and many others.

Dr. Kituku is the founder and executive director of Caring Hearts and Hands of Hope, a non-profit organization that raises funds to sponsor orphans and other needy children in high school and universities/colleges in Kenya. Fighting hunger, disease and illiteracy are priorities in Vincent's mission, both in the US and Kenya. He also serves as a member on the board of directors for Idaho's largest YMCA. He was the chairman of the Boise Rescue Mission, Idaho's largest provider of shelter and meals for homeless people.
